SOFAR (South Fork of the American River) Cohesive Strategy – This is an ambitious ongoing fuel reduction operation between several agencies within the American River Canyon as well as throughout the Sierra to reduce the dead tree build up and lower the fire risk around our cabins. Cal Trans is doing road clearance and the forest service is partnering with PG&E to clear debris near populated areas. PG&E has made a more active effort to make sure that downed trees and debris are removed from our lots.
